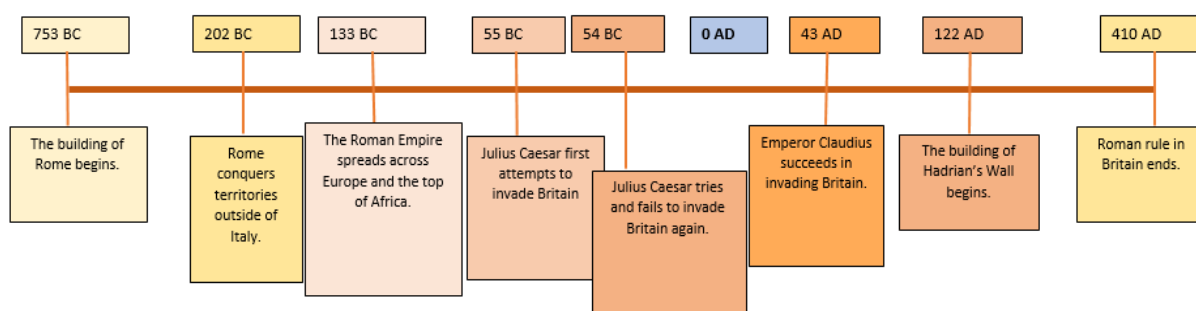


Inquiry Knowledge Organiser

Roman Britain



Key Vocabulary	
Ally	A group which have agreed to work together with one or more other groups, e.g. Some tribes became allies with the Romans
Anno Domini	Latin for 'In the year of the Lord.'
Aqueduct	A bridge structure which is used to carry water.
Artefact	Things people have used in the past.
Auxiliaries	Non—Roman citizens (from countries that the Romans had conquered) who were soldiers in the army.
B.C.	Before Christ
Balista bolt	A large metal dart fired from the Romans' war machine.
Boudica	A queen of the ancient British Iceni tribe who led an unsuccessful revolt against the Romans.
Celts	The name we now give to a group of people who lived in Britain before the Romans invaded. The Romans call them Britons.
Century	A division of the Roman army made up of 80 soldiers and led by a centurion.
Conquer	To take control of a place by fighting.
Consul	The highest position in Roman government.
Druid	A powerful priest of the pagan religion in Britain.
Empire	A group of territories ruled by one single ruler or state.
invaders	People who use force to enter a place and take over, usually within an army.
Revolt	When a person or group refuse to accept the rules and power of another person or group.
