| Technology | new inventions that help people |
| Thatch | dried straw used on a roof |
| Victorian | from the time of Queen Victoria |
| Wood | material from trees used to build |

What will I know by the end of the unit?

- Homes are built from different materials such as brick, wood and glass
- Materials are chosen because they are strong, waterproof and safe
- Homes in the past were made from materials that were available at the time
- Homes have changed over time (e.g. from fireplaces to central heating)
- Victorian homes were different (no electricity, outdoor toilets, fireplaces)
- Not all homes in the past were the same (rich and poor differences)
- Some things stay the same (homes still have rooms like kitchens and bedrooms)
- Homes change because of technology and people's needs
- We learn about the past using sources and evidence like photos and objects
