



**What should I already know?**

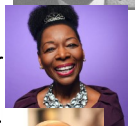
- Children have used different sources of evidence to collect evidence about the past.

**Baroness Floella Benjamin**— a famous children’s author, presenter and member of the House of Lords who moved to the UK from Trinidad in 1960



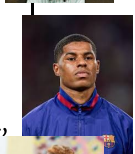
**Paul Stephenson** – activist and organsier of the Bristol Bus Boycott

**Marcus Rashford**—an English footballer and campaigner against racism and child hunger of West Indian descent

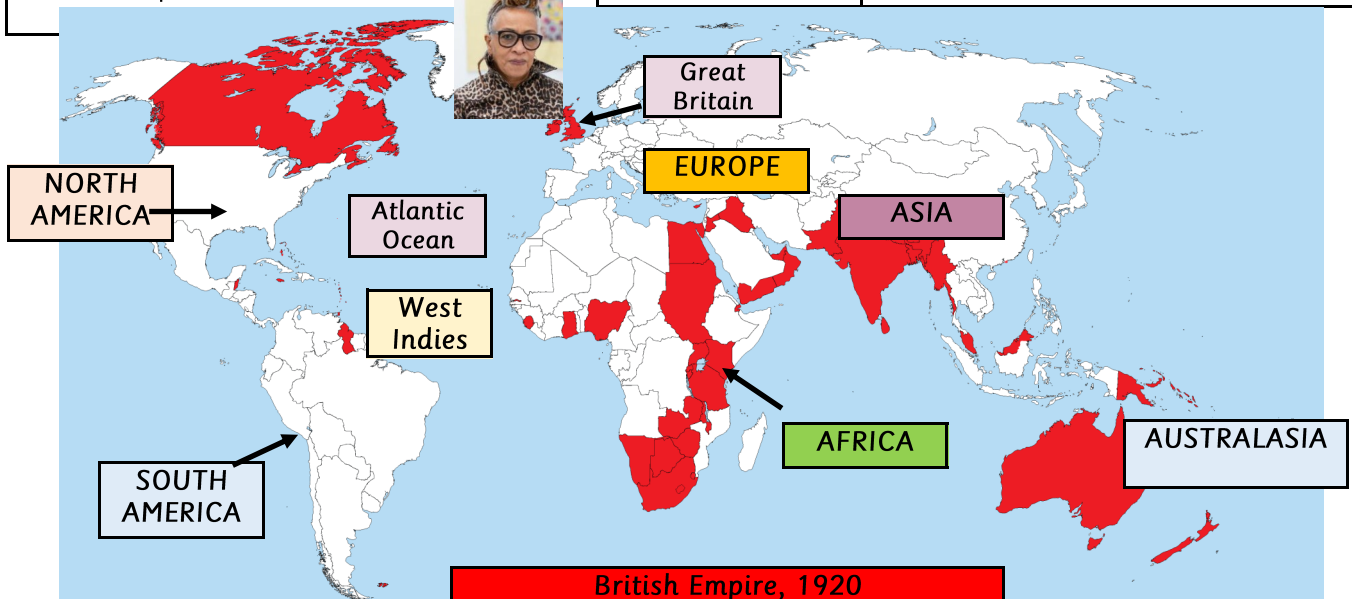


**Veronica Ryan**— a Monserrat born, British sculptor



**Vocabulary**

<b>Caribbean</b>	a region of the Americas made up of thousands of islands (collectively known as the West Indies)
<b>Commonwealth</b>	a group of former territories of the British Empire, led by King Charles III
<b>Citizen</b>	being a <b>legal member</b> of a country and having <b>rights</b> there because of it
<b>Empire</b>	a <b>group of territories</b> ruled by <b>one single ruler or state</b> . Empires are built by countries that wish to <b>control lands outside of their borders</b>
<b>Migrant</b>	a <b>person</b> who has chosen to live in a country where they were not born
<b>Racism</b>	the belief that some races are better than others
<b>Windrush Generation</b>	those that came to the UK after WW2 from the Caribbean at the invitation of the British government to live and work
<b>World War II</b>	A global war that lasted between 1939-1945.
